Preaking patterns of isolation and socialization are essential to mental health recovery. The activities program at Thomas M. Wernert Center (TMWC) encourages members to get involved and try something new.

At TMWC, Bianca handles the planning and facilitating clubroom activities and outings for the members. As TMWC Activities Specialist, she is also responsible for bringing guest speakers to TMWC, collaborating with other departments on activities and outings, and finding local volunteer opportunities for members.

"Planning a variety of fun and exciting activities for members to enjoy is the best part of my job," say Bianca. She understands the importance of having "play time," even as an adult. Trips to a Toledo Mud Hens games, picnics at Toledo MetroParks, or visits to a local coffee shop are just some of the outings she has planned for members. "I am grateful TMWC allows me to be creative and make all of these recreational activities possible."

By participating in TMWC activities, members are able to explore and have fun, while also learning about community resources and volunteer opportunities. For the past few months, Bianca and peers picked up trash downtown as part of The City of Toledo's Litter League competition. Soon, they will begin volunteering at Same Café in the Lucas County Library, doing kitchen work and food-prep.

"I am inspired by individuals who want to do good things in their community and make the world a better place and leaders who give a voice to those who are underrepresented or marginalized," Bianca says.

Bianca has invited local professionals from the Toledo Zoo, Toledo Lucas County Library, The Alzheimer's Association, Toledo City Council, and experts in the areas of Mental Health and advocacy to share their expertise with members. "It always feels great to hear that a member learned something new during a forum, had a great time on an outing, was



able to de-stress, or felt more connected with their peers after participation," Bianca adds.

Bianca has a Bachelor's degree in Recreational Therapy from University of Toledo, and a Masters in Recreation Administration. She is also a certified therapeutic recreation specialist (CTRS), and is working on a personal trainer certificate. Along with outings and forums, her job also includes clubroom events and games.

As someone with lived experience, Cyd uses her work as a vessel to share with others.

Making art has been a coping skill that has helped Cyd through physical and mental challenges. Throughout the months of August and September, Cyd has been sharing her art and her coping skills with TMWC members as part of the Expressive Arts Program. Participating members are learning the basics, including pencil shading, the color wheel, and other techniques

helpful to a starting artist. Cyd's artistic style shines through in her teaching, as she uses playful practices to make art more approachable.

Audio elements also play a role in Cyd's class. "Music helps to relax the mind and better understand emotions," Cyd says.

"My art has a focus on experiential, visual, and interpretive programming. I create visuals intended to soothe the soul and simultaneously help people to problemsolve when coping with tough times or facing difficult decisions," she adds.
